

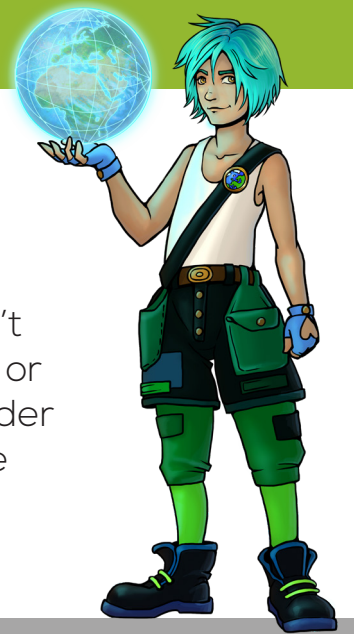
# PLANETSKÖTAREN

# Different, But Mostly Equal

It's not always easy to imagine another person's life, but try to imagine what it would be like if you were someone else – someone with different abilities than the ones you have. Who would you be? Which abilities would you have? Which abilities would you lack?

- Try to get dressed using just one hand. Another really tricky challenge is to tie your shoes with one hand.
